Construction of the Central-West Orana REZ transmission project began in June 2025 and is now progressing across multiple locations, with activity increasing as the network takes shape.

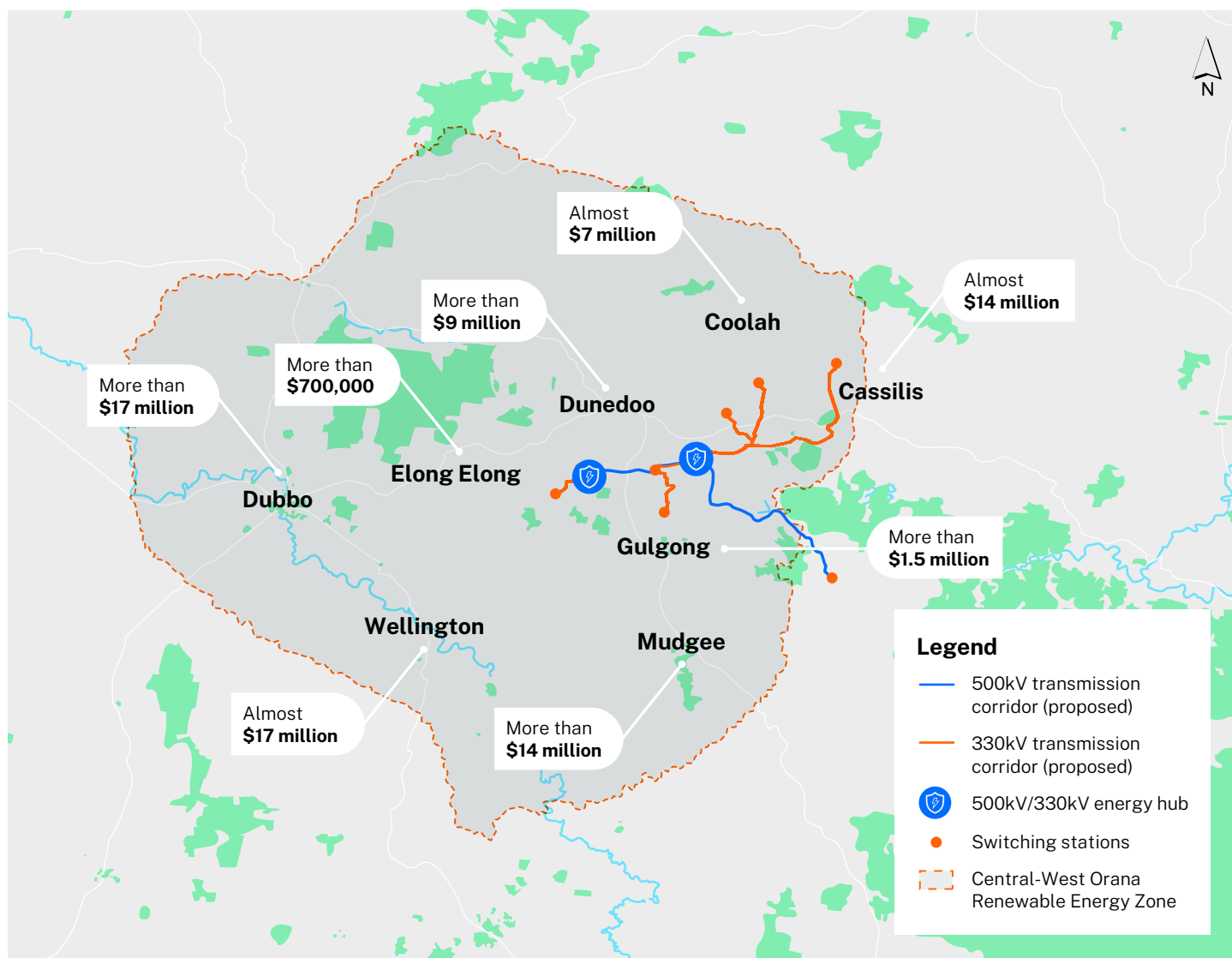
Spotlight: Upgrade of Binnaway Showground

Delivering benefits and opportunities

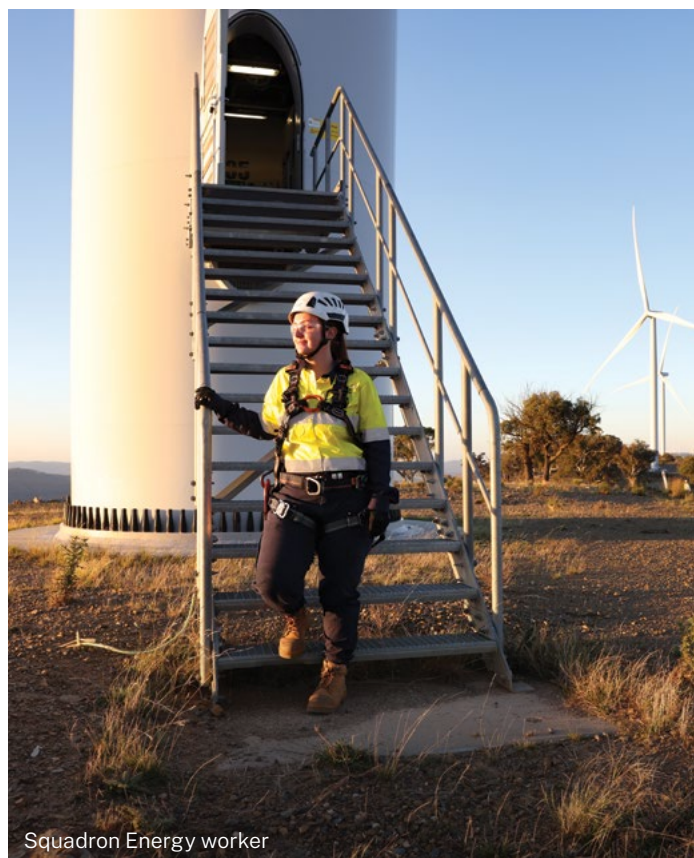
The Central-West Orana Renewable Energy Zone (REZ) is helping create opportunities for local businesses, workers and future generations across the region.

As the REZ develops, demand is increasing across a range of industries, including construction, manufacturing, transport, retail and local services. More than 100 local businesses and suppliers are already contributing to the transmission project, helping deliver infrastructure while supporting jobs and economic activity throughout the region.

Connecting local businesses with renewable energy projects

With a growing pipeline of renewable energy projects across NSW, strengthening local supply chains has never been more important.

New renewable energy directories developed by EnergyCo and the Industry Capability Network (ICN) are helping local businesses showcase their capabilities and connect with clean energy project opportunities. The directories make it easier for project developers to find local suppliers, manufacturers and service providers.



Women in Construction Taster Program

Supporting pathways into renewable energy jobs

Training initiatives have helped local people secure work linked to the REZ. Participants in the recent free, nationally accredited Renewables Taster Program gained practical experience in site safety, machinery operation, traffic control and work readiness.

NSW Government-funded programs also support women, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and long-term job seekers. Nine women who recently completed the Women in Construction Taster Program in Dubbo and Wellington secured local roles in traffic control, civil construction and labouring.

The REZ is also helping inspire future workers. More than 800 students from Years 5 to 10 recently participated in the National Science and Engineering Challenge in Dubbo, exploring careers in science, engineering and energy through hands-on activities.

Together, these initiatives and many others are helping communities across the Central-West Orana region share in the opportunities and benefits of the renewable energy transformation.

Women in Construction Taster Program

Construction is progressing

Construction of the Central-West Orana REZ transmission project began in June 2025 and is now progressing across multiple locations, with activity increasing as the network takes shape.

EnergyCo is planning and coordinating the delivery of transmission infrastructure, with ACERZ responsible for designing, building, operating and maintaining the network.

This infrastructure will carry electricity from wind, solar and storage projects to homes, farms and businesses across NSW – supporting a more reliable and modern energy system.

Energy hubs and switching stations

Work is progressing at Sandy Lane, Barigan Creek and Elong Elong energy hubs and 330kV switching station sites at Birriwa, Uarbry East, Sandy Creek and Cobbora.



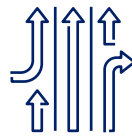
Transmission lines

Along the alignment, crews are progressing tower foundation works, including piling, concreting and ground earthing, as well as pre-assembly and erection of transmission towers.



Workforce accommodation

At Merotherie, building of the temporary workforce accommodation village continues, including delivery and installation of units and facilities to support the growing construction workforce.



Road upgrades

Upgrades to Merotherie Road are ongoing, including construction of the new Leo Nott Bridge over the Talbragar River.

Acknowledging Aboriginal cultural heritage incident

A serious incident during construction led to the permanent loss of a registered Aboriginal cultural heritage site, a rock shelter. We recognise the importance of this site and the distress this has caused to Traditional Owners and the wider community.

EnergyCo expects all work to meet strict heritage protection requirements. In this case, ACERZ did not meet those requirements. The NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure is investigating, with ACERZ cooperating fully. ACERZ has strengthened controls to better protect cultural heritage.

We will continue to work closely with Wiradjuri Traditional Owners and share findings when available.

First use of Port of Newcastle to REZ route

The first use of the upgraded Port of Newcastle to Renewable Energy Zone route marks a major milestone for regional NSW and the state's clean energy future, with Squadron Energy successfully delivering components to its Ungula Wind Farm in the Central-West Orana REZ.

The Port of Newcastle to REZ route — from the Port of Newcastle to the Central-West Orana REZ — has been designed by the NSW Government, with more than \$110 million in funding, to support the safe and efficient transport of critical equipment needed to build renewable energy projects.

This milestone demonstrates the route is now operational, enabling the movement of oversize over mass (OSOM) vehicles carrying large wind and solar components from port to site, while helping to reduce disruption for regional communities.

Upgrades along the route are now nearing completion.

Over the past year:

- Road upgrades have been completed at 13 locations
- Powerlines have been raised at more than 50 locations to allow safe passage of large equipment

New pullover bays between Newcastle and Elong Elong are under construction, with all works scheduled for completion in late 2026. Once finished, these bays will complement existing roadside facilities and provide more opportunities for motorists to safely pass OSOM vehicles.

These upgrades will not only support the delivery of renewable energy projects but also provide lasting benefits for the region, including improved road safety, reduced delays and more efficient travel along key freight routes.

Travelling safely around oversize over mass vehicles

When travelling on roads used by OSOM vehicles:

- be patient and allow extra travel time
- only overtake when safe and directed
- follow instructions from escort vehicles and traffic controllers
- keep a safe distance from large loads.

By working together, we can help ensure roads remain safe for everyone while supporting the delivery of important infrastructure for NSW's energy future.

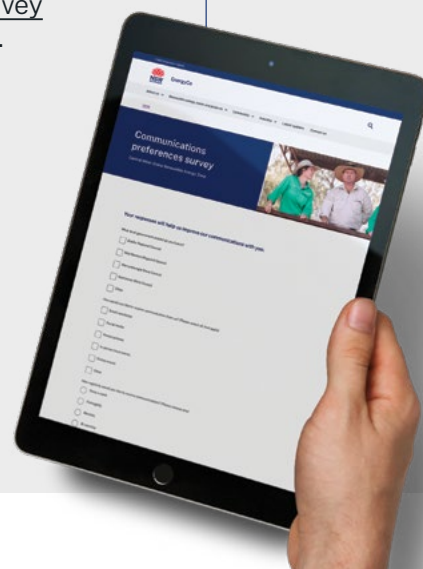
