Media Release Communities to influence design of Hunter Transmission Project

Monday, 20 November 2023

Communities in the Hunter are being invited to share input and feedback on the proposed route for the Hunter Transmission Project as the NSW Government accelerates the shift to renewable energy.

The Hunter Transmission Project will be instrumental in transporting electricity from the New England and Central-West Orana Renewable Energy Zones to homes and businesses in the Hunter, Sydney and the Illawarra, as coal-fired power stations retire and more clean, affordable energy comes online.

After extensive investigations, the Energy Corporation of NSW (EnergyCo) has identified a 115kilometre proposed corridor between Bayswater and Eraring. Importantly, the corridor maximises use of government land and co-location with industrial and existing infrastructure.

EnergyCo believes the proposed route strikes a reasonable balance between different land uses and minimises the use of privately-owned land.

Landowners who host transmission infrastructure will receive increased payments under the state's Strategic Benefit Payments scheme.

The proposed route is now on public exhibition until Monday, 18th December 2023. It is an important opportunity for the community to seek information and have their say on the design of the final route.

EnergyCo will continue working with local communities over the next 18 months to get the details right and ensure construction of the Hunter Transmission Project maximises benefits to the region. The project is expected to be operational in 2027-28.

In addition to securing a reliable supply of clean electricity for the Hunter and other big population centres, the Hunter Transmission Project will provide a significant boost to the local economy. The NSW Government is committed to harnessing the Hunter's diverse skills base during delivery of this project, and maximising benefits for local businesses.
