No NSW Government funding proposed for the Project (except potential terminal value payment at end of concession period)



Robust and innovative financial structure for equity and debt to enhance financeability and facilitate flexibility



Availability of concessional financing by Clean Energy Finance Corporation is under consideration

EOI shortlisting approach of potentially two but no more than three Applicants for RFP Stage



Clear scope and interface requirements definition at RFP release



Early regulatory stakeholder engagement to manage approvals (AER, ASL, AEMO)



Alignment with EnergyCo's key probity principles and ensuring a level-playing field


