## **REVISED TERMS OF REFERENCE:**

EDOS spoke to recent changes and suggestions.

RRG endorsed the revised Terms of Reference.

## INTRODUCTION OF NEW HCCRRG MEMBERS:

The Chair welcomed Jeffrey Drayton and Amanda Wetzel to the RRG.

The Chair informed the RRG that Nathan Towney has stood down from the group. The RRG acknowledged his contribution.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS AND UPDATES:**

KB spoke to existing HTP monthly update and suggested this be pulled into a single document for all projects.

PO – asked if a point of contact for each project could be included in the report. SMW – highlighted the importance of making the report meaningful and reflects the objectives in the Terms of Reference.

AW - Asked about the possibility for updates on non-development projects. Specifically anything in the social benefits and outcomes policy space that would be advantageous for the RRG to understand.

## **WARATAH SUPER BATTERY:**

EDOS advised the RRG that the Waratah Super Battery project won Best Public Sector Energy Transition Initiative award at the Smart Energy Excellence Awards held in April 2025.

## **NEWCASTLE LOGISTICS PRECINCT:**

Presented by Lemuel Yeung, Design Project Manager

- PO Queried about construction of the project.
- LY A market process will be undertaken to understand capability and appetite, and this will inform packaging options.
- CA Raised that the site has been flagged to be used by The Port of Newcastle over the years.
- LY Discussions with Port of Newcastle are continuing.
- AW Acknowledged the significance of the Intertrade site to the socio-economic and industrial history of the community and asked how this dimension would be factored into the project planning.

#### ACTION:

SMW – Requested that the scoping report and community engagement plan be circulated to the RRG.

#### **HUNTER TRANSMISSION PROJECT:**

Presented by Carolyn McCallig, HTP Planning and Environment Lead

- SM Raised her desire to see worker accommodation camps to be reused for future projects.
- JD Agreed with SM and wanted to better understand what benefits there are for the communities near the worker camps.
- DW and AS Also agreed about the legacy opportunities of worker accommodation camps.
- CM Workers would have the opportunity to utilise local amenities.
- SM Would like to see the worker camps built to a standard that could support over 55s or emergency accommodation.
- CM Will make a note to circle back to Council.
- PO Questioned why a HTP webinar on social and economic assessment outcomes had not been scheduled.
- CM advised it was the final technical reports to be completed, and a webinar would be scheduled soon.

## **ACTION:**

EnergyCo to provide Councils a more comprehensive briefing on the proposed on the worker accommodation sites.

SMW – Welcomed the Business and Industry visitors.

SMW – Asked the group about what the opportunities and challenges for EnergyCo's projects in the region?

Key themes discussed – Information sharing, providing more opportunities for small businesses, big opportunity for local businesses to be involved, build up next generation of workers, take a more portfolio view of requirements rather than individual projects, important to understand what can be done and what is possible, both in the short and long term.

JFS - Enquired if an analysis of existing HV Businesses had been undertaken to look at what local services (supply, maintenance, and engineering) need to be regionally maintained during the transition (away from coal and associated generators) to support the projects that will be delivered in the region.

AH – EnergyCo is looking to develop a portal with ICN to overcome constraints of smaller businesses and increase their visibility.

AT – Businesses would benefit from being across the pipeline of works so they can prepare before work package goes out for tender on ICN.

AH – Flagged that DPIRD has established programs around capability building and provides an opportunity to educate local businesses in the Hunter.

EDOS – EnergyCo are working with other stakeholders to look at getting some additional information on the job opportunities and pathways resultant from the Energy Transition

IW – Keen to understand the alignment across the different projects as well as DPIRD and ICN.

SMW - Asked the group what their key message is for EnergyCo to takeaway.

 There is a need for clear messaging and a portfolio approach to communicate the opportunity to ensure proactive facilitation for local businesses to be able to participate.

- There is a need for large work packages to be disaggregated and clear articulation about the scale and scope.
- The importance of not underestimating the amount of time and effort to get information out to local businesses.
- Transmission of information given there is an unequal level of understanding, the aggregation of information to connect with small and larger businesses is necessary.
- The co-design and delivery of meaningful and enduring community benefits (both hard and soft infrastructure) is a regional priority a close working relationship with EnergyCo will be fundamental.

BN- Suggested mandated Structured Engagement Forums. This could be that EnergyCo contractually require its head contractors for both transmission line and substation packages to participate in regular, formal dialogue forums facilitated by New.E and HunterNet. Ideally these forums commence prior to final contract award.

SMW wrapped up the discussion with a commitment toward ongoing dialogue and engagement and the importance of regional cooperation.

The Chair thanked everyone for their contribution to the discussion and reaffirmed the RRG's commitment to positive and constructive engagement and consultation with business and industry in the region. There being no further business the meeting closed at 12:06pm.
