

Survey work on local roads from Monday 12 August

August 2024

EnergyCo is carrying out survey work on local roads to inform our planning for the New England Renewable Energy Zone (REZ).

What are we doing?

We will carry out survey work in the road reserve using handheld survey tools, mounted tripods and light vehicles. This work is necessary to inform our environmental assessment and design for the New England REZ network infrastructure project. Work will be carried out at various locations including:

- Whitehouse Lane and Marsden Park Road intersection, Calala
- New England Highway and Nundle Road intersection, Nemingha
- O'Briens Lane and Nundle Road intersection, Nemingha
- New England Highway and Whitehouse Lane intersection, Kingswood
- New England Highway, Aberdeen
- Invermein Street and Stair Street intersection, Kayuga
- Bengalla Road and Wybong Road intersection, Castle Rock
- Kayuga Road and Wybong Road intersection, Muswellbrook.

Work hours and timing

We will be working from **Monday 12 August** between **7am and 5pm, Monday to Friday**, subject to weather and site conditions. Work will be carried out progressively and will take around two days at each location.

What will this mean for you?

Traffic control, reduced speed limits and temporary shoulder closures will be in place for the safety of pedestrians, workers and motorists.
